

CHILDCARE BENEFITS, TAX CREDITS & DEDUCTIONS

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT FOR A PARENT/PRIMARY CAREGIVER TO FILE A TAX RETURN?

The [Notice of Assessment](#) you receive from the Canada Revenue Agency after filing your income tax will be the proof of income asked by your municipality for child care subsidy purposes; if you qualify, childcare subsidy will help you cover the cost of child care for your child.

Additionally, to have access to the [Canada Child Benefit \(CCB\)](#) you will need to file income taxes for the year prior. If you are an international student you may get this benefit after being in Canada for at least 18 months.

HOW TO FILE

WHAT TO CLAIM WHEN FILING

DEDUCTIONS

Parents can claim the [Child Care Expense Deduction](#) when filing their income tax to reduce the amount of tax that they might have to pay. Detailed and up to date eligibility information is available through the [Canada Revenue Agency](#).

Amounts may change from year to year; currently you can claim up to a maximum of 8,000 for each child aged 6 and under; 5,000 for each child aged 7-16 years, and \$11,000 for each child at any age with a severe and prolonged mental or physical impairment.

TAX CREDITS

Both the Children's Fitness Tax Credit and the Children's Art Tax Credit were eliminated as of the 2017 taxation year, replaced by the [Canada Child Benefit](#).

BENEFITS

[Canada Child Benefit \(CCB\)](#) is a tax-free benefit paid monthly to the parent of raising children under 18 years.

HOW DO I APPLY?

If you have never received the Canada Child Benefit (CCB) before, have had a baby, have become the primary caregiver for a child or have moved to Canada, you will need to apply for the CCB in one of the following ways:

If you have previously received child benefits, you don't need to reapply, but you do need to file an income tax return every year.

HOW MUCH CCB WILL I RECEIVE?

The amount you will receive will depend on several things, including the number of children and your family income (line 236 of your income tax). The CRA has an [online benefits calculator](#) that estimates the amount you will receive.

The CCB does not affect the amount families receive from child care subsidies, Ontario Student Assistance Program (OSAP), Healthy Smiles Ontario, or portable housing benefits.

Staff & Faculty Child Care Benefit Plan
